

The Royal Australasian College of Physicians (RACP)

To become a General Medicine Physician you will need to apply for fellowship with The Royal Australasian College of Physicians. Fellowship is a 6 year (full time) training pathway consisting of 3 years (full time) Adult Internal Medicine - Basic Training followed by 3 years (full time) Advanced Training in General and Acute Care Medicine.

Entry requirements/pre-requisites

- General Medical Registration with the Medical Board of Australia (earliest entry is PGY2).
- Secured a Basic Training position at an accredited training hospital or health service.
- Discussed your application and received approval to apply for Basic Training from the hospital (or network) Director of Physician Education (DPE). The DPE's approval is subject to selection processes, training capacity and/or performance of the prospective trainee. Australian trainees are required to have their online application approved by their DPE.

Application and selection process - how to apply

In Queensland, first year Basic Training Positions (BTP1) are recruited and managed directly by the individual Hospital and Health Service (HHS), not via the Network. The College is not responsible for trainee recruitment. Information relating to the training positions in hospitals accredited by the College to provide Basic Training is accessed via the available positions search tool for the RMO Campaign website. The Queensland Basic Physician Training Network provides centralised recruitment, selection and allocation of Basic Physician Trainees (BPT) intending to commence their second or third year (BPT2 and BPT3) of training in Queensland and are registrar level appointments.

In Queensland, there are 4 network rotations: Far North, Northside, Southside and Coastal. Both Wide Bay hospital facilities form part of the Southside Network Rotation. Hospitals in this rotation include Bundaberg Hospital, Greenslopes Hospital, Hervey Bay Hospital, Ipswich Hospital, Logan Hospital, Mater Hospital, Princess Alexandra Hospital, QEII Hospital, and Toowoomba Hospital.
