The Royal Australian & New Zealand College of Psychiatrists (RANZCP)

To become a Psychiatrist, you will need to apply for fellowship with <u>The Royal Australian & New Zealand College</u> <u>of Psychiatrists</u>. Fellowship is a 5-year (full time) training pathway consisting of three stages:

- Stage 1: 12 months basic level Adult Psychiatry (includes 6 months in an acute setting).
- Stage 2: 24 months proficient level rotations (includes mandatory 6 months Child and Adolescent Psychiatry rotation, mandatory 6 months Consultation-Liaison Psychiatry rotation, and 12 months of elective rotations).
- Stage 3: 24 months advanced level rotations (Trainees select 4 x 6 month elective rotations).

A Certificate of Advanced Subspecialty Training (24 months) can be commenced concurrently in Stage 3.

Entry requirements/pre-requisites

- General Medical Registration.
- Completion of PGY1.

Application and selection process - how to apply

Queensland Health Clinical Directors of Mental Health Services in conjunction with the Queensland Branch Training Committee (QBTC) and <u>Office of Postgraduate Training in Psychiatry</u> (PGT) oversee Psychiatry training rotation placements into Queensland facilities.

To obtain a Psychiatry training placement, prospective trainees must 1) complete the Psychiatry Training Program Preference Form and submit to the Postgraduate Coordinator at <u>PGT.PAH@health.gld.gov.au</u> and 2) submit an online application through the <u>RMO Campaign</u> to secure an employment contract with your preferred training site. It is also recommended to make contact with the Chief Training Supervisor at the training site you have indicated in your preference form to discuss your plans.

Once you have secured an accredited training position, you can register with the College to commence your training.

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

Regional training opportunities in Central Queensland

There are currently 17 Psychiatry registrar positions in Central Queensland Mental Health Alcohol and Other Drug Service (MHAODS)*. *Position data valid as at April 2021.

The following table provides an overview of the Psychiatry training program and which stages/rotations the Mental Health Alcohol and Other Drug Service are accredited for:



The Central Queensland Mental Health Alcohol and Other Drug Services Rockhampton, Yeppoon, Gladstone, Biloela, Moura, Woorabinda and Central Highlands districts and adult patients of the Central West Hospital & Health Service. Services offered include Acute and community-based Adult Psychiatry, Alcohol and Other Drugs Services, Extended hours crisis response, Older Persons Mental Health Inpatient, Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, Psychogeriatrics, Outreach Services, Consultation/liaison Psychiatry, Indigenous Mental Health Services, Forensic Mental Health Services, Community Care Unit, Electro-convulsive Therapy and a Step-Up Step-Down Unit; therefore trainees receive a richly diverse, varied and flexible learning experience as they progress through their training requirements.
