The Royal Australasian College of Physicians, Australasian Chapter of Addiction Medicine (RACP-AChAM)

To become an Addiction Medicine Physician, you will need to apply for fellowship with <u>The Royal Australasian</u> <u>College of Physicians, Australasian Chapter of Addiction Medicine (RACP-AChAM)</u>. Fellowship is a minimum 6 year (full time equivalent) training pathway, consisting of two alternate entry points – completion of the 3 years (full time equivalent) RACP Basic Training OR fellowship with another eligible Specialist Medical College. This is followed by 3 years (full time equivalent) Advanced Training in Addiction Medicine consisting of:

- 18 months Core Training
- 18 months Non-Core Training

Entry requirements/pre-requisites

- General Medical Registration with the Medical Board of Australia.
- Completion of RACP Basic Training (including written and clinical examinations) OR have fellowship with another eligible Specialist Medical College, Chapter or Faculty. - Secured employment in an appropriate Advanced Training position.

Application and selection process - how to apply

To be selected onto the Advanced Training in Addiction Medicine Program, applicants must first secure a position with an <u>accredited training facility</u>. In Queensland, there is no central allocations process for Addiction Medicine positions, recruitment to training positions is managed directly by the training facility.

New and current trainees need to <u>apply for Advanced Training</u> each year with RACP. Once you have secured an Advanced Training position, you must prospectively apply for approval as per the <u>RACP Progression through</u> <u>Training Policy</u>.
