



# ANAESTHESIA

## Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (ANZCA)

To become an Anaesthetist, you will need to apply for fellowship with the [Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists](#). Fellowship is a 5-year (full time equivalent) training pathway consisting of 4 training periods:

- 6 months Introductory Training
- 18 months Basic Training
- 24 months Advanced Training
- 12 months Provisional Fellowship Training (PFT)

### Entry requirements/pre-requisites

- General Medical Registration with the Medical Board of Australia.
- Be a citizen of Australia or New Zealand or a permanent resident of Australia.
- 24 months prevocational medical education and training (earliest year of entry is PGY3), including at least 12 months of broadly-based clinical experience in areas other than anaesthesia, intensive care medicine or pain medicine.
- Secured a registrar position in an accredited training department (for Queensland, this is done through the RMO campaign).

### Application and selection process – how to apply

There is a two stage process to becoming an anaesthetic trainee. The first is the [application](#) to the College (ANZCA) which can occur after 52 weeks of prevocational medical training (end of PGY1). Selection into the ANZCA program is based on your written application addressing the selection criteria and CV, an interview and supporting referee reports.

The second stage is registration which occurs once a trainee has secured a training position within an ANZCA accredited department.

In Queensland, the [Queensland Anaesthetic Rotational Training Scheme \(QARTS\)](#) is a sponsored body that is responsible for the overall recruitment and administration of the placement process, and they work closely with Queensland Health, therefore, prospective trainees need to apply for a training position through the [RMO campaign](#).

Once you have secured the training position through the RMO campaign, you can then apply for registration with ANZCA and commence your training.

## Map your Anaesthetic training pathway in Central Queensland

It is expected that all ANZCA trainees complete rotations in core, metropolitan and regional hospitals. In Queensland, there are 4 networks: Northern Hospital Rotation, Central Hospital Rotation, Gold Coast Hospital Rotation and Southern Hospital Rotation.

Rockhampton Hospital is a regional hospital which forms part of the Central Hospital Rotation, the Gold Coast Hospital Rotation and the Southern Rotation. Hospitals in the Central Hospital Rotation network include: Caboolture Hospital, Hervey Bay-Maryborough Hospitals, Ipswich Hospital, Queensland Children's Hospital, Redcliffe Hospital, **Rockhampton Hospital**, Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital, Sunshine Coast University Hospital and The Prince Charles Hospital.

Hospitals in the Gold Coast Hospital Rotation network include: Gold Coast University Hospital, Logan Hospital, Lismore Base Hospital, Queensland Children's Hospital, **Rockhampton Hospital** and The Tweed Hospital.

Hospitals in the Southern Rotation include: Bundaberg Hospital, Ipswich Hospital, Logan Hospital, Mater Hospital, Princess Alexandra Hospital, QEII Jubilee Hospital, Queensland Children's Hospital, Redland Hospital, **Rockhampton Hospital**, The Prince Charles Hospital and Toowoomba Hospital.

**Please note that progress through the rotation is dependent on successful application to QARTS at PGY3, PGY4 or PGY5 for entry and ANZCA requirements for each training year.**
